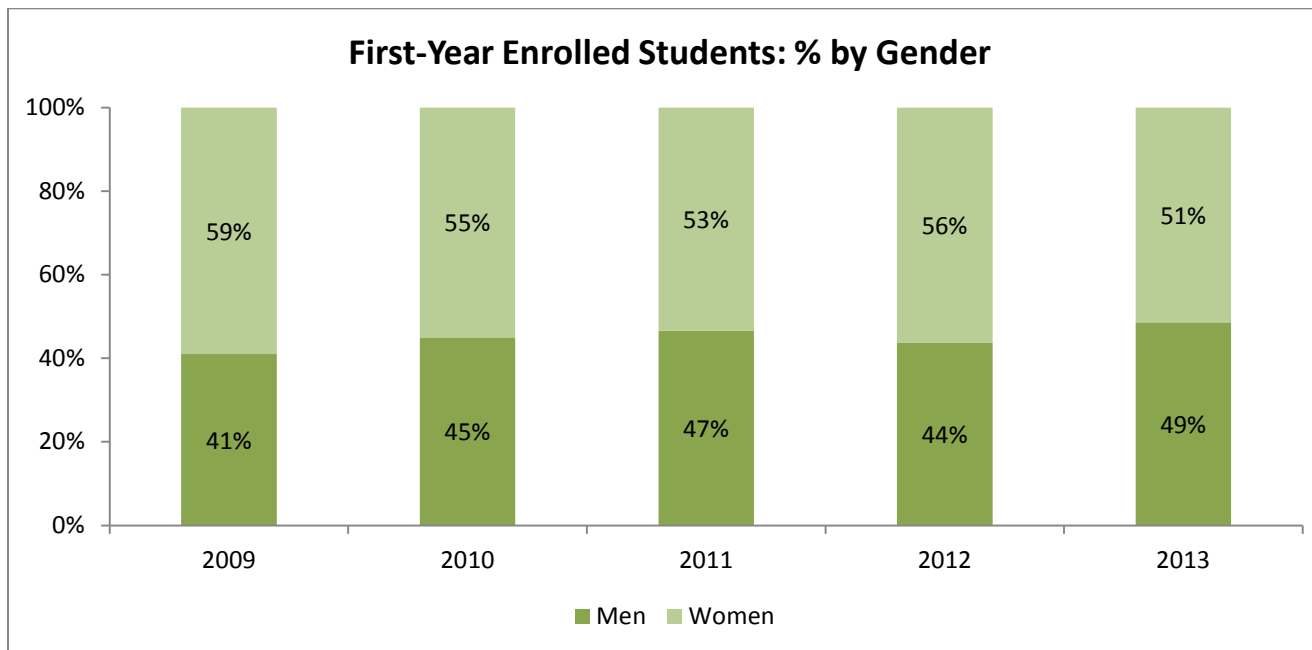

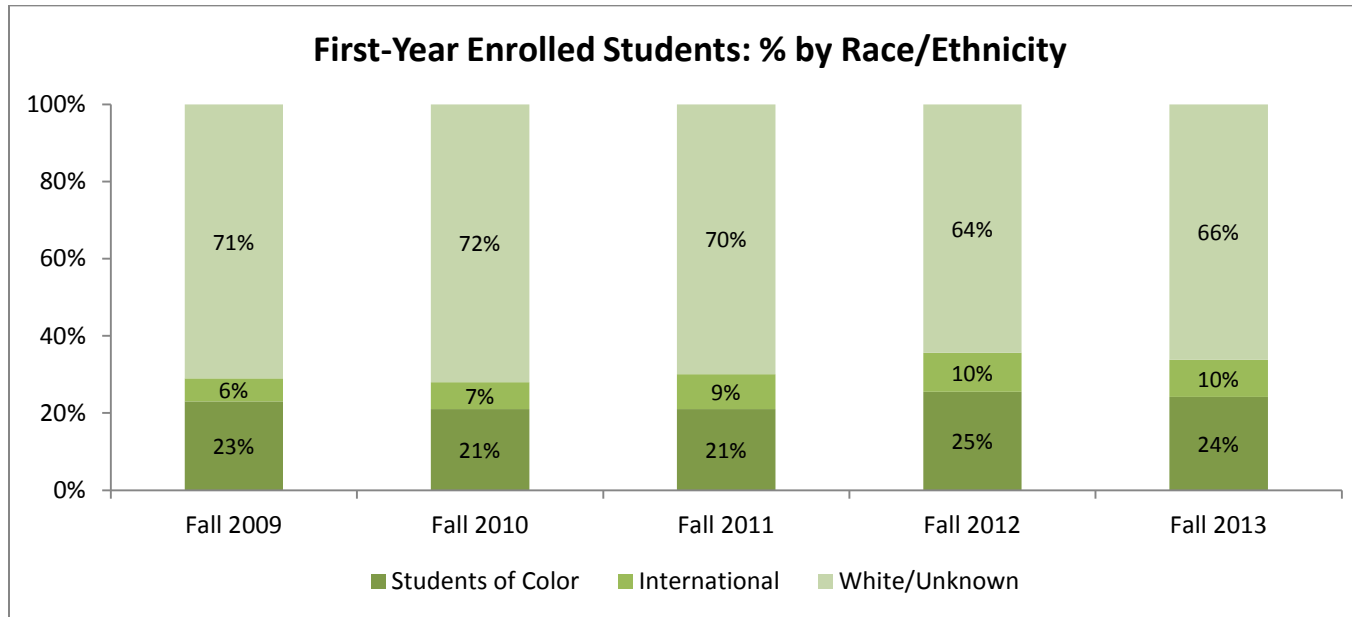

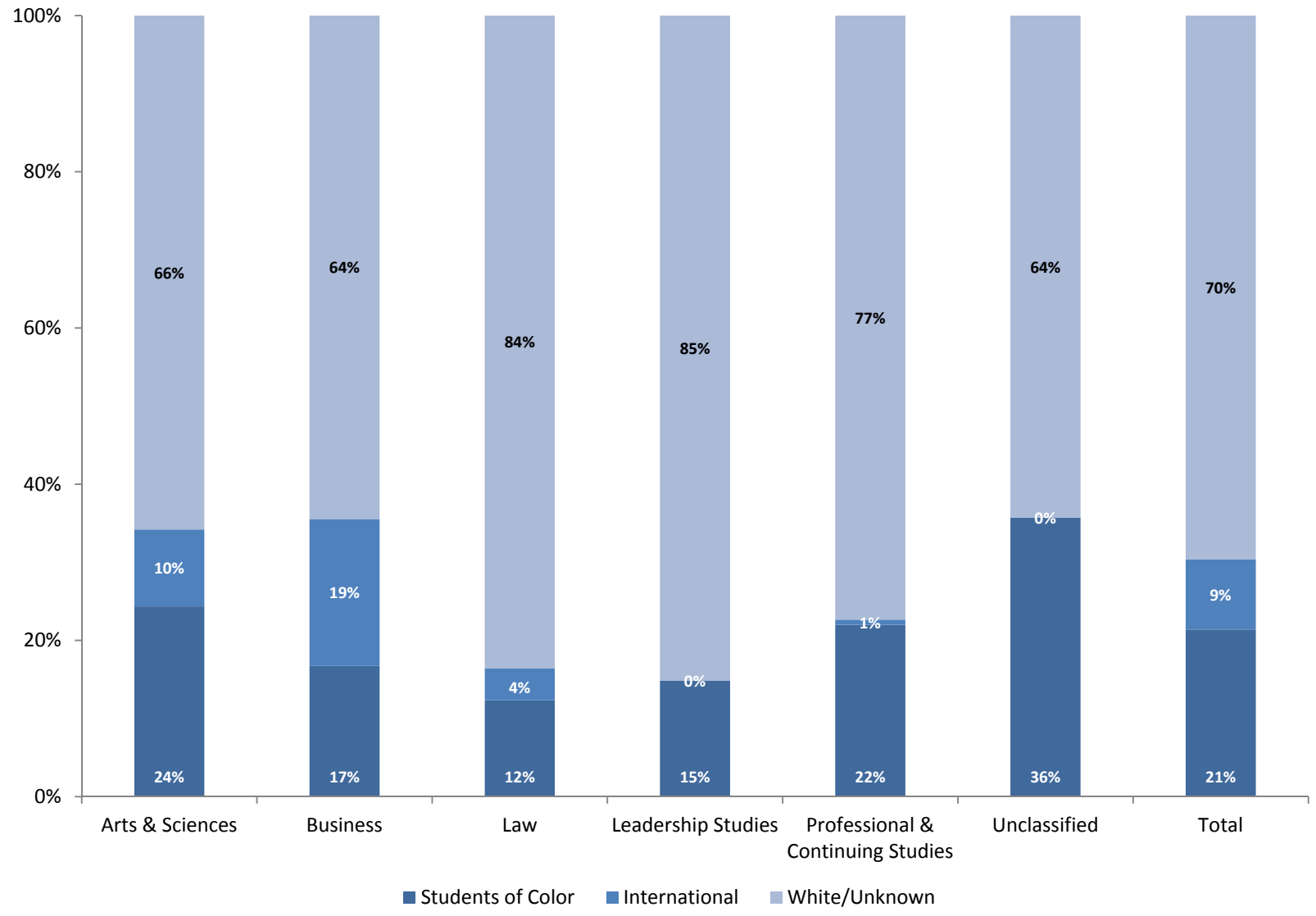

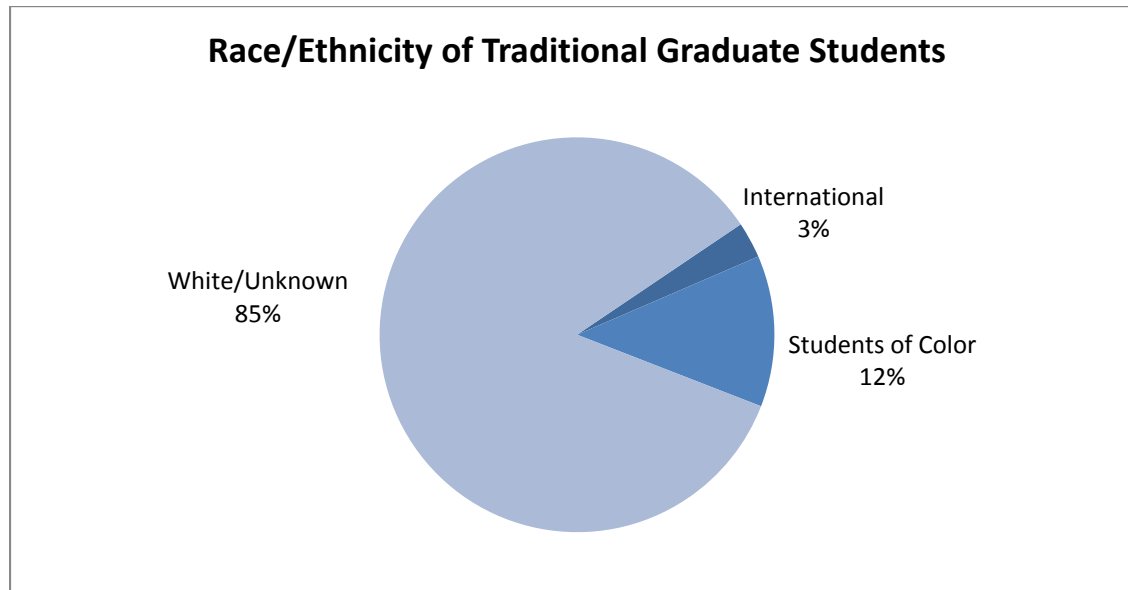

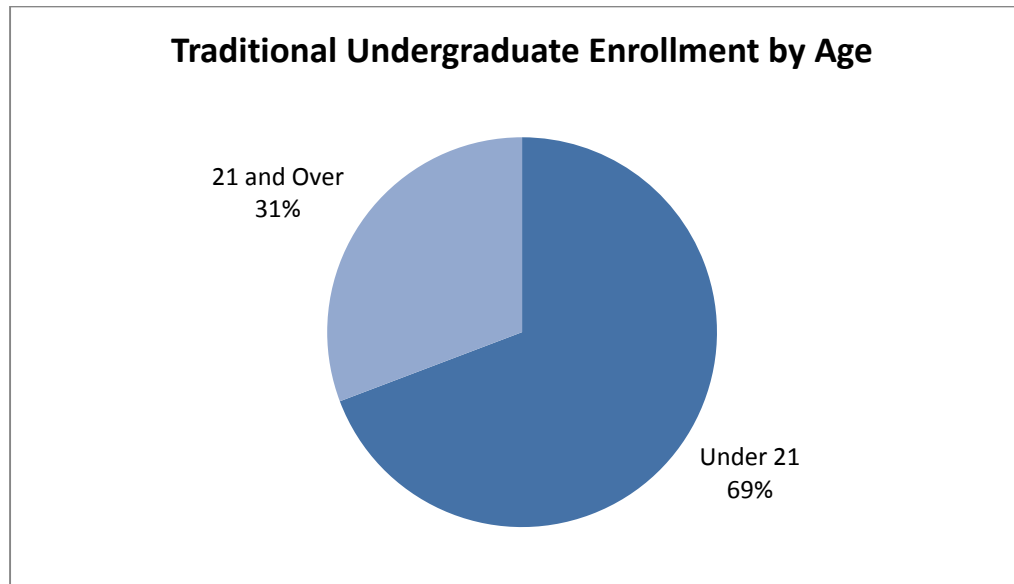

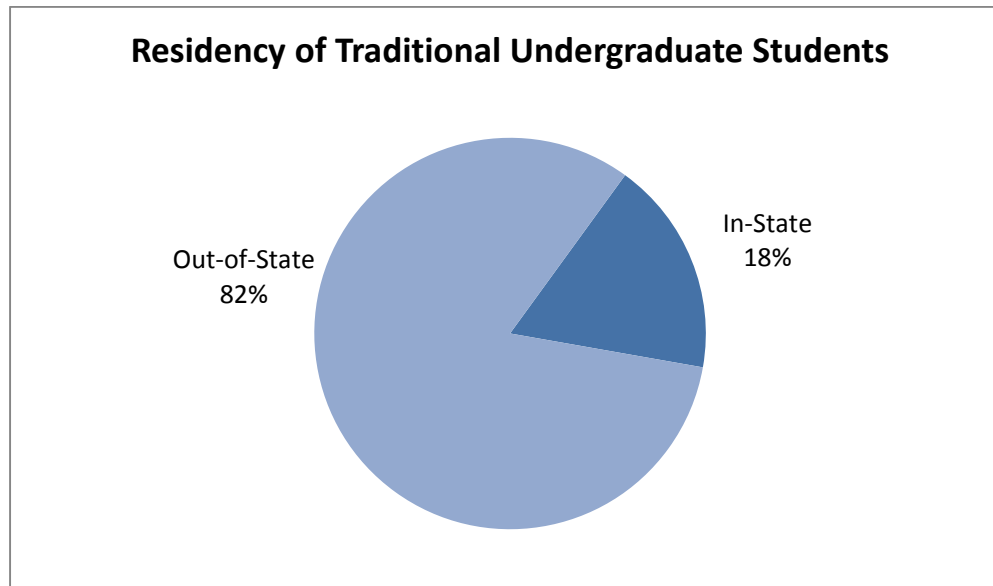

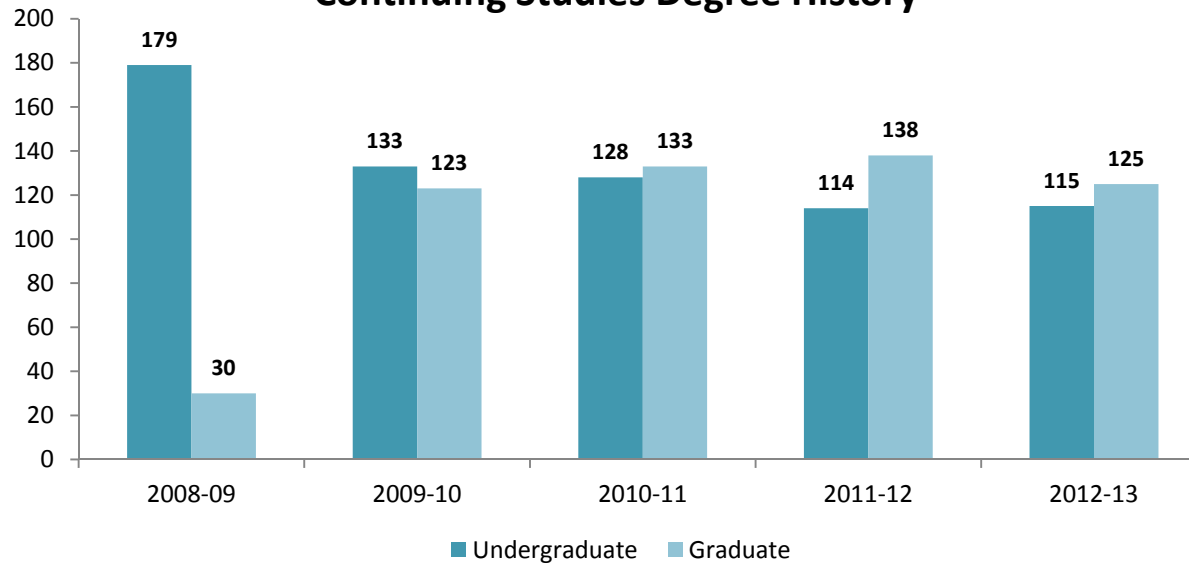

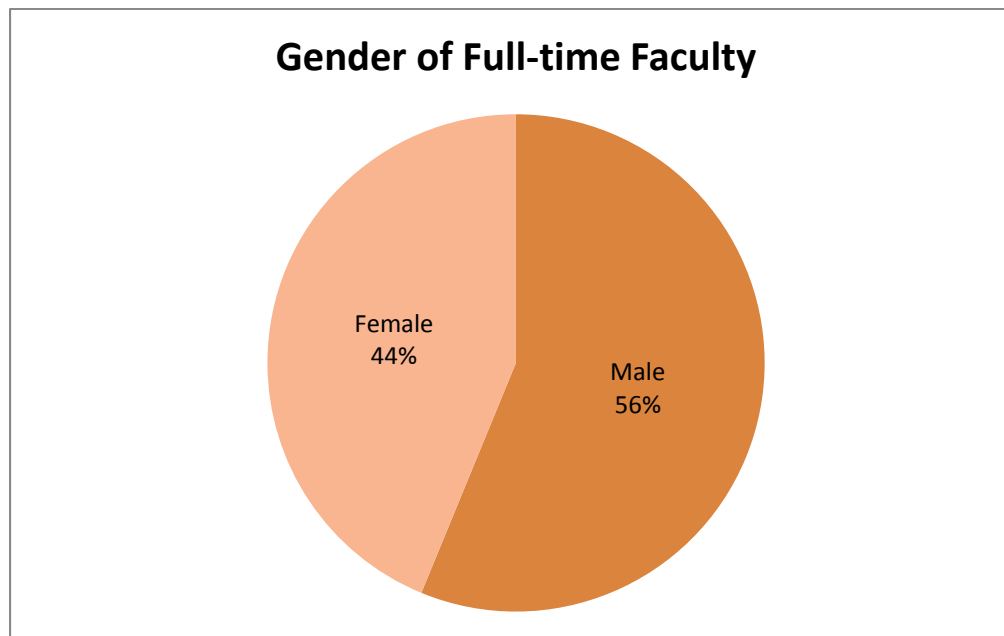

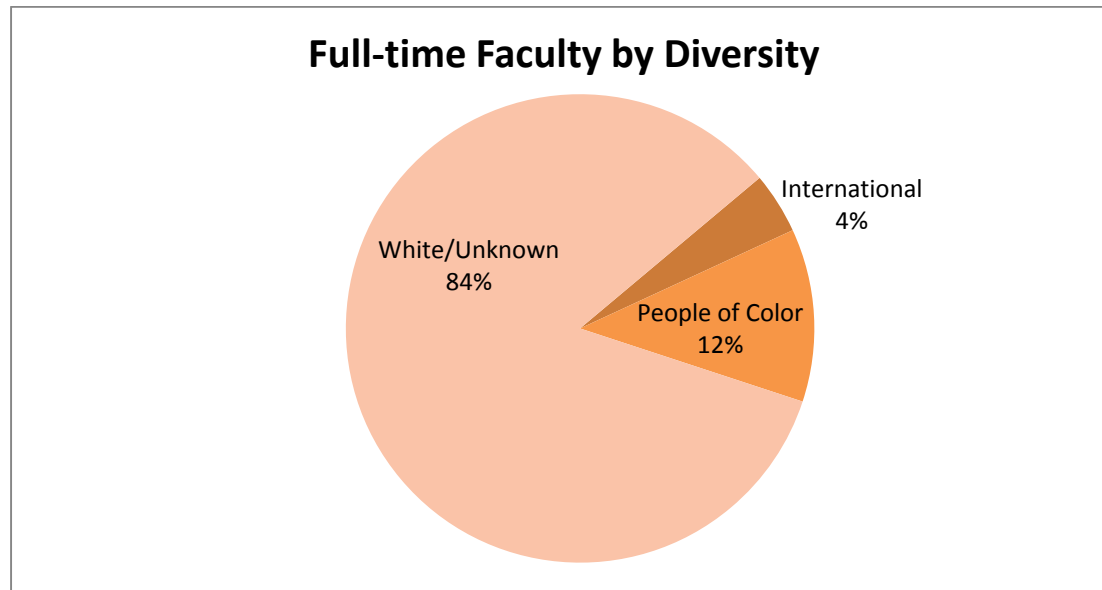

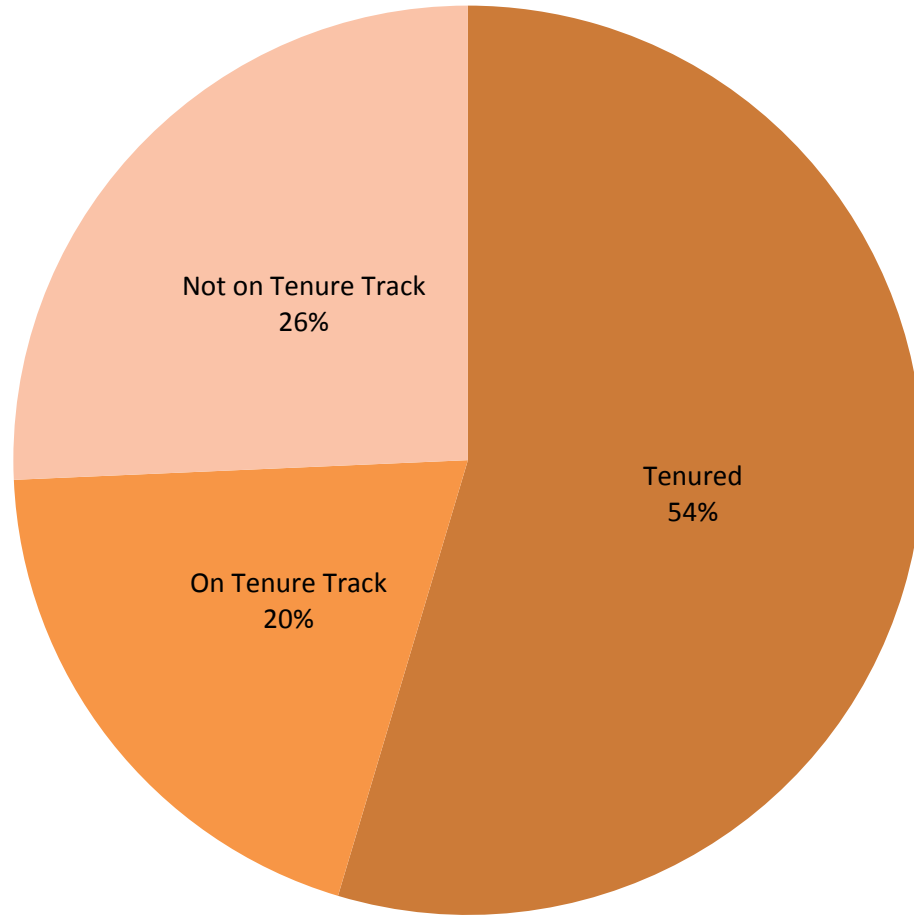

Tenure Status of Full-Time Faculty

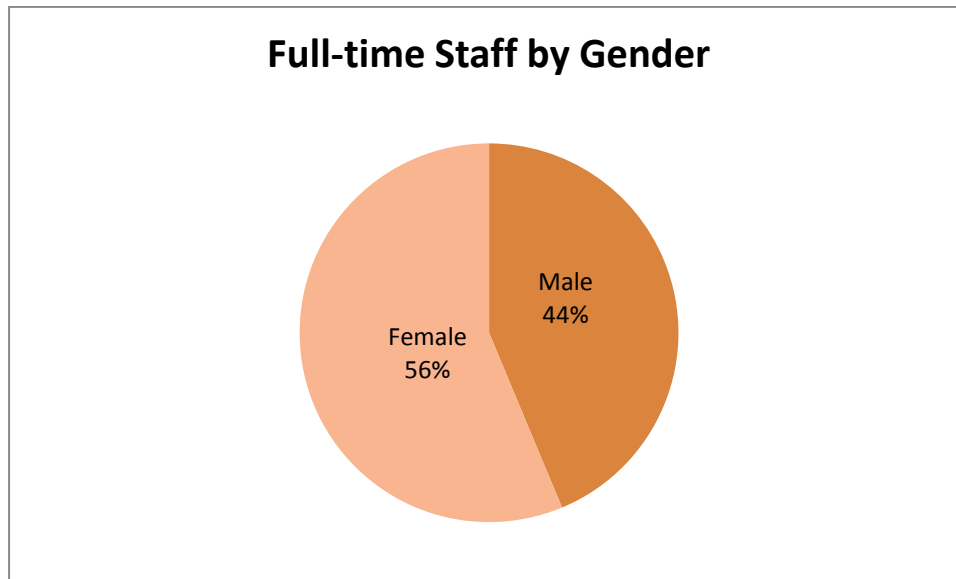

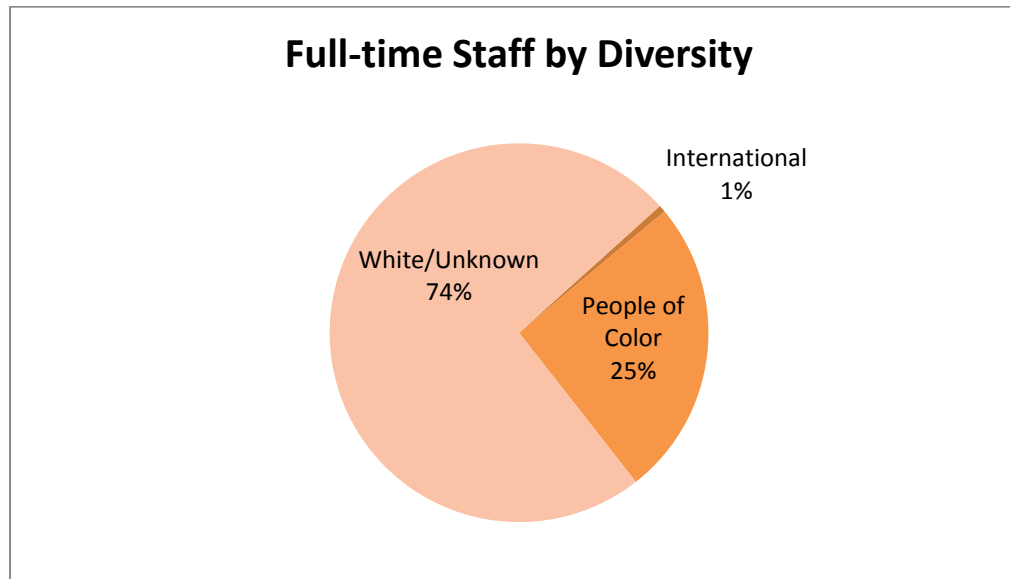
